Hudson is a suburb located 15 miles north of Akron and 20 miles southeast of Cleveland. The Hudson City School District is comprised of the city of Hudson and small parts of Boston Heights Village, Boston Township and Cuyahoga Falls. Approximately 4,684 students attend the six Hudson schools. This highly competitive institution is a four-year comprehensive high school that offers a challenging college preparatory program. The school has an enrollment of 1,453 students in grades 9 through 12.

### ACHIEVEMENTS

- #16 ranked public high school in Ohio and #1 in Summit County according to *US News & World Report*.
- 7 Hudson High School students have posted perfect "36" Composite Scores on the ACT in the past 2 years.
- 24 Advanced Placement courses are offered. All AP students must take the Advanced Placement test.
- 173 Hudson High School students were inducted into the National Honor Society in the 2022-2023 school year.
- 197 Hudson High School graduates in the class of 2023 earned the State of Ohio Honors Diploma.
- 242 seniors graduated with designated honors in 2023: 85 earned Cum Laude honors (3.67-3.99); 76 earned Magna Cum Laude honors (4.00-4.32); 81 earned Summa Cum Laude honors (4.33 and above).

### NATIONAL MERIT QUALIFYING TEST

22 seniors in the class of 2023 have been recognized as National Merit Scholars: 5 as finalists and 17 as commended. For the past five years, HHS has honored an average of 24 National Merit Scholars.

### SPECIAL PROGRAMS

#### 25 Advanced Placement Courses Offered

643 students took 1434 AP tests in May 2023 with 80% scoring three and above. All students enrolled in AP classes are required to take the AP examinations. Courses offered: English Language, English Literature, US History, US Government, European History, Economics: Micro and Macro, Psychology, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics C, Environmental Science, Computer Science, Precalculus, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, French, Spanish, Latin, German, Mandarin, Music Theory, and Studio Art.

#### New Dimensions

New Dimensions is College Credit Plus, rigorous interdisciplinary Humanities course that consists of Psychology, Philosophy, Anthropology, and Sociology. This highly selective program, team-taught by Social Studies and English faculty, is composed of seniors chosen through application and interview. The coursework stresses critical thinking and debate, primary research, study trips, and the attendance of cultural events. Students complete a 50-60 page research paper through both primary and secondary research.

#### Service Learning

Service Learning was recognized by the Ohio Department of Education as a “model program” in 2009 as a highly selective interdisciplinary approach to American Government, Contemporary Issues, and British Literature with an emphasis on learning through service. Each student completes approximately 200 service hours per year and participates in the USA Freedom Corps. The Service Learning program seniors logged an impressive 18,566 hours of community service in 2021.

#### Technology

The Hudson Schools dedicates support to a 1:1 iPad program for all students in grades 6-12. This leaning opportunity will supply each student in grades 6-12 with an iPad for their educational use. Teachers will continue to utilize Google Apps for Education as a learning management tool in classrooms.

#### Career Programs

26 Six District Compact career programs include work experience in skilled and technical occupations through cooperation with five other area school districts.

#### Credit Flexibility

Students who wish to pursue an interest or subject in greater depth than available through the regular curriculum can apply for credit flexibility. Credit can be earned through either demonstration of mastery or enrichment through experience or performance.

#### Student Volunteer Program & Peer Collaboration

Students volunteer their free time in the schools, in classrooms as peer collaborators and in the community. This enables them to grow in responsibility by caring for others. A community service .25 credit is granted after a minimum of 30 service hours are completed.
